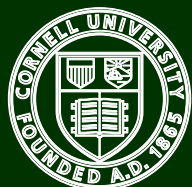

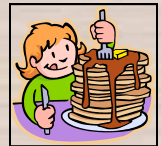
The Leader's Association Fall Fundraiser

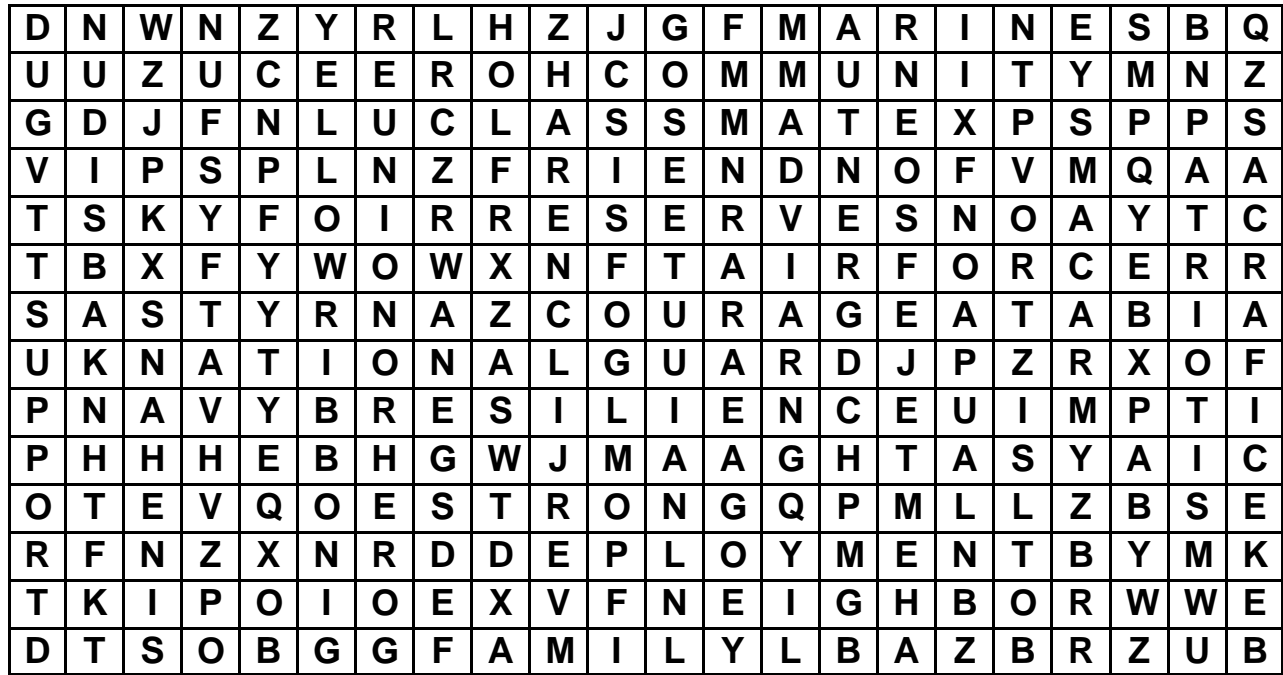

OUR MONTHLY CHESS FEATURE... Clearer Thinking:

Over the course of recorded chess history, blindfold games have provided for lots of amazement on the part of the general public. There is a blind and rapid tournament held each year called the Amber Blind & Rapid. It is an invitation only tournament sponsored by Dutch billionaire Joop van Oosterom. Mr. vO also happens to be a World Chess Correspondences Chess Champion. Last year's tournament had a prize fund of 216 thousand Euros. The participants are provided with brand new state of the art laptop computers that they get to keep.

Hungarian Grandmaster, and former World Vice Champion, Peter Leko uses the Ruy Lopez opening in this game to stun his Armenian pal Levon Aronian. The game was played in the blind mode. The Ruy Lopez is an old but solid opening choice that is used at all levels of chess. See if you can identify a fork and pin that Leko uses. Notice how both players align their rooks in the center of the board. Try to find some opportunities for discovered attacks even though they don't take play in the game. Checkmate is a long way off when the game ends with a loss of a queen.
